‘Attend to sorry Labuan sights’

LABUAN: The Consumer Protection Association of Malaysia, Labuan branch has urged the relevant authorities to attend to sights that are in a sorry state, posing danger to the public and sending a wrong message about Labuan.

Its Chairman, Datuk Chan Seh Chung, cited as example the narrow road leading to the bus terminal from Jalan Tun Mustapha.

He said the road was in a deplorable state and in dire need for repair, adding stretches of the road have sunk and often filled with puddles of water after rain.

“Not only the bus drivers but the general public who use bus services are complaining

about the bad road which is not only dangerous but also causing much inconvenience,” he said.

According to him, the bus drivers tried to repair the road by themselves but this did not help much.

Chan also cited a signboard of Lembaga Pemasaran Pertanian Persekutuan (Pama) at a public parking area near Millimewa Supermarket.

He said the signboard was in a dangerous state and should be removed before any untoward incident occurs.

He urged the local authority to ensure that companies re-locating or winding up operations remove their signboards as well.
